



Trailhead Parking for Horse Trailers

Tahoe City: Tahoe City South trailhead (also known as the 64-acre lot) has space for trailer parking available. *Note: Peak season hours may limit parking.* Tahoe City North trailhead is not recommended for horse trailers.

Brockway Summit: Parking on both sides of Hwy 267 near the trailheads is not recommended. Available parking is possible 0.2 miles past the summit on USFS road (16N92) leading up to Martis Peak.

Mt. Rose Summit: This is an entirely paved parking lot, with vaulted toilets, and considerable parking space. It has room for a few trailers. However, this trailhead is a popular destination and parking space may be limited on weekends and holidays during the summer.

Tahoe Meadows: Has limited designated space for trailers. *Note: Peak season hours may limit parking.* Additional parking is available on the shoulder of Hwy 431.

Spooner Summit North: Parking is available on the north side of Hwy 50 (0.5 miles east of the trailhead) designated for trailers (west of NDOT sand shed).

Spooner Summit South: Limited trailer parking is available. *Note: Peak season hours may limit parking.* Additional parking is available on the shoulder of Hwy 50.

Kingsbury Grade North: There is limited roadside parking – however, a few trailers will fit. *Note: Peak season hours may limit parking.*

Kingsbury Grade South: Heavenly Stagecoach Parking area provides adequate space for trailer parking.

Big Meadow: Designated trail parking is available but unfortunately fills up rapidly. The parking lot entrance has very sharp turns and can be challenging. Additional parking may be available 1.5 miles west of Big Meadow on the shoulder of Hwy 89.

Echo Summit: Paved parking is located on the north side of Hwy 50 in the Snow-Park lot.

Echo Lakes: Parking is not recommended. Limited parking and narrow roads will cause difficulties for trailers.

Barker Pass: Barker Pass has adequate parking for trailers with easy trail access in both directions.
