Trail Organization

A trail organization who exemplifies a successful trail program including maintenance or upgrading the quality of trails to improve the trail experience, increase user safety, and/or enhance protection of the environment. Additionally the organization has increased environmental awareness, promoted trail-related safety, provided educational programs for youth and adults, encouraged trail-related outdoor recreation and, overall, enhanced trail use and enjoyment.

Business/Non-profit/Agency Award

Award is given to an organization/agency that has demonstrated successful efforts to support the trail community in planning, trail protection, trail development, maintenance, philanthropy, the recruitment of volunteers, funding or interest in the sustainability of long term trails programs.

Lifetime Achievement Award

Presented to an individual volunteer or trails professional who has been a leader for more than 20 years on behalf of trails in the Sierra Front. This category is not necessarily recognized every year.
